2. FISCAL MANAGEMENT

Discussion of the 2022-2023 tentative budget.

Mr. Novak presented, discussed and answered questions in regards to the 2022-2023 tentative budget.

Fiscal Year 2022 Budget to Actual Review (July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022):

- Ended with a surplus of approximately \$6.5 Million 5th straight year with overall surplus
- The 24th, 25th, & 26th salary payment to teachers was reversed due to auditor's decision per our "cash basis" accounting method. This decreased expenses by about \$1.2M and increased the expected surplus. The 24th, 25th, & 26th salary payments will now take place as originally scheduled.

- Revenues Were Extremely Strong Due to Increased Replacement Tax Collections & Additional State and Federal Funds
- Total CPPRT collections were at \$9.6M, about \$5 6M greater than historical average.

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Summary (July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023):

- 2021 Property Tax Extension is not finalized
 - Second installment tax bills may be significantly delayed, possibly even six months (January 2023 instead of August 2022)
 - The delay may cause short-term cash flow shortage
 - We are reviewing our short-term cash flow and will be making recommendations to the Board at the August meeting
 - Solutions could include interfund loans among the operating funds, permanent interfund transfers, or through the issuance of tax anticipation warrants (TAWs).
 - A TAW draws against the anticipated property tax and would be payable when the property taxes are received.
 - The tentative budget presented tonight does not address the potential short-term cash flow shortage
 - State Evidence Based Funding (EBF) is forthcoming
 - Expected Surplus of Just Over \$2 Million (All Funds)
 - Local tax collection assumption set at 96%
 - Replacement tax revenue projected to remain strong to very strong for FY23, but still likely less than the over 9M collection in FY22.
 - Budget includes federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) IDEA & ESSER III
 monies, along with other federal funds such as Title I, II, IV, and IDEA grants.
 In total these federal funds account for approximately 2.5M in funding.
