Students in those classrooms have Individual Education Plans (IEP) that require them to be in a junior high or grade school setting. At this time, no junior high or grade school in the co-op could accommodate. So, the Board made adjustments to have those students in a hallway in AERO that could accommodate their IEP's. Then moved two classrooms to Reavis of students that have been in our building so it is familiar to them. Ms. O'Dowd asked if all the students from the Co-Op have moved into the new building. There is an average of 11-12 students per classroom with a maximum allowed at 14-15. Dr. Schwarz added that students from the 2 classrooms here at Reavis do travel to the AERO Therapeutic Center daily for electives that are held there.

#### Ms. Schultz, Principal

We are preparing for parent teacher conferences this October 10 from 1-7pm. Student families will begin receiving information regarding the signup process Monday, September 25. We will offer three different Parent University programs at this Fall's Parent-Teacher Conferences on Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>. These informational sessions will take place in the R3 and last 30 minutes each. Parents can attend as many of them as suits their interests and needs. Presentations include **Attendance Matters** by Ms. Kelly Miller, **ACCESS Testing Info for ELL Families** by Ms. Teresa Zoltek-Kwak & Ms. Krystyna Nasinska, and **Advanced Placement Info for Parents** by Mr. Mike Jebens & Ms. Katy Cunningham.

## Dr. Schwarz, Director of Support Services

On Tuesday October 10th, the night of parent teacher conferences, the school counselors will be hosting "Career Options Night" in the student cafeteria from 5-7p.m. We have currently secured 27 representatives from the trades, military and junior college certificate training programs. We are reaching out to students next week during Advisory, who have expressed interest in these career pathways, to help prepare them to engage in meaningful conversations with these representatives. It is through Career Options night that one of our students, who was

a junior last year, spoke with David Fiar, the head of the welding program at Moraine. Our student, who is currently a senior, is now attending Moraine's welding program while finishing his coursework here at Reavis. He certainly has a jumpstart on a very viable career.

Last week, Bill Lauer and Jamie Johnson, from the Dean's office, trained an additional 14 staff members on de-escalation and behavior management skills from the Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI). As part of our restraint and time out reduction plan, submitted to the State of Illinois, we invested in Bill and Jamie becoming certified trainers in order to train our staff. This CPI session currently brings our trained staff total to 32. We will run an additional session to train teachers this Spring.

During the month of September, the Behavioral Health Team has been promoting mental health awareness and suicide prevention. This coming week, all freshmen and junior students will complete a screening in their P.E. and wellness courses to assess behavioral and emotional strengths and weaknesses. The team will use the results as a guide to plan and implement interventions with students this school year. We will also be conducting an additional screening in October through Erika's Lighthouse with all freshmen students focusing on adolescent depression and signs of suicide.

#### Ms. Jooste, Division Chair of PE, CTE and Fine Arts

The PE/CTE/Fine Arts department has many things going on, but what I will highlight tonight is the curriculum work and planning that is being done for the B.E.S.T. course that will run next semester. We have had several meetings with the Burbank Fire and Police Departments and I'd like to publicly share our appreciation to Chief Gilgenberg, Deputy Chief Casey and Officer Malacina for their time and the information that they have provided us that is helping us build this course that will truly present the students with experiences and knowledge about being a Fire or Police person.

#### Dr. Riordan, Superintendent

Dr. Riordan began by inviting the Board and all students and families to attend the ABC7 Chicago Friday Flyover happening this week.

On behalf of Mr. Novak, CSBO, Dr. Riordan updated the Board on two reports that are required to be published on the website by October 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. The first being, Public Act 970609 which is salary information for IMRF employees. The second being, Public Act 0970256 which is administrator and teacher salary. Both of these will be posted to the website tomorrow.
